Another excellent census result, 16,247 members in ScoutsWales, a 5.3% overall growth. Well done to everyone for playing your part. Recruitment and then the retention of members, whether young people or adults, is a team effort, showing Scouting has a product worthy of promotion and providing the challenges and activities that our youth members look forward to.

For those who like a bit of detail:

- Since 2011 after 6 years of decline and 4 of growth, our numbers are nearly back to where they were 10 years ago.
- Beavers have been increasing over the last 4 years and are now above the 2001 census.
- Cubs have been increasing over the last 3 years and are now above the 2003 census.
- Scouts have been increasing over the last 5 years and are now above the 2003 census.
- Explorer Scouts have increased each year (apart from a minor blip in 2005) and double the Venture Scout numbers of 2001.
- Adult membership has increased over the last four years and is very close to the 2002 census.

Dare I hope that 2012 will see a similar rise, taking us to the 2001 figures overall or beyond?

Not forgetting the back room boy Steve Lewis, our Sites and Services Manager, whose task is to make all the contacts and arrangements for the cruise. SHELTERBOX

I am very pleased to report that three boxes have been purchased outright by ScoutsWales having been funded by your contributions and another box part funded in the same way.

At the present time the boxes are in storage and have not yet been deployed. However, it is good to know that they are ready and waiting to help families who may suffer disaster in some part of the world.

Thank you for your efforts and as soon as we know where our boxes have been sent we will let you know.

ANY TREK CARTS OUT THERE????

1st Panteg (St Mary's), Torfaen District is celebrating its Centenary. We are trying to recreate some of our history including the day we dropped the vicar off a trek cart in 1933. But we no longer have a trek cart so is there anyone out there who can loan us one. We are also looking for the loan of a bell tent. Can any one help?

Our troop started out as an Incorporated Church Scout Patrol. A Scouting organisation started by the CLB. We also know that our members attended the Windsor rally in 1911. So all those old photos with Scouts with their hats turned up on the side were Church Scouts as in the last issue of Scouting. We have the original toll book and were able trace their sacrifices in the WWI and discovered five generations had been through Scouting.

After working with historians at the Church Lads Brigade, we were able to produce a list of other Groups. It would be nice to know if those groups, if they still exist, are aware of their history so here is list of the those in the old Diocese of Llandaff. Prior to 1920 and registered in 1910/12: Grangetown Cardiff; St Mary the Virgin Cardiff; St Mary's Glyntaff; St Hilda's Griffithstown; St John Skewen Neath; Avan Vale Port Talbot; St Mathews Pontypridd; Llanishen Glamorgan; Christchurch Ynysbwl . They were all attached to a local Anglican Church. Though the CLB stopped ICSP in 1915 these groups continued as Church Scout Troops or registered with the present Scout Association between 1915 and 1939. We believe St Mary's Glyntaff may have registered with the present Scout Association as one of their boys became a District Commissioner Mr Harold Knight!

Here is a point of conjecture. BP did not register his Scouting organisation till 1911 at the behest of King George after, the famous lamb bone dinner. The Incorporated Church Scout Patrols were registered in 1909 with, of

all things, the Board of Trade. The CLB were using Aids to Scouting 1901 so who was the first Scouting organisation? That should give folks something to argue about.

So if any one can help with a trek cart or the bell or would like to know more about Church Scouts please contact me.
