© Welcome back after the summer “break”. I hope you have managed to enjoy some sun whilst at camp or on holiday, my part of N Wales would seem to have had more than its fair share of rain, relatively speaking.

Talking of rain, I am sure you will all have shaken your heads at the enormity of the Pakistan flooding. The scale of the flooding is just unimaginable. The desolation immense and the numbers involved incredible. But Pakistan is not the only country to be deluged; Brazil, China and Guatemala have all experienced recent flooding.

You have probably heard of ShelterBox, (you can look them up on-line). It is a Cornish charity, established in 2001 to help earthquake victims in Gujarat and now supporting countries experiencing any major disaster, by sending boxes full of tents and equipment to help provide families with shelter, a means to cook and keep warm. Each box costs £490 and the contents vary according to the needs of the area to which it is sent. Haiti, Kashmir, Uganda and Mexico to name just a few, have all received their help.

So I am asking you all to support an appeal for ShelterBox.

For most Sections and Groups, £490 is too much to collect, but if we all club together Welsh Scouting may be able to help provide at least one and hopefully more. Please send your donations by cheque made payable to ‘The Welsh Scout Council’ and marked “ShelterBox” on the reverse by 28th February 2011. Whether you send £5 or £55 it all adds up to providing much needed help across the world and you know your money is being used for something really needed.

Did you come to the Conference in April? Do you ever ask what the Welsh Scout Council does for you? The two questions are connected.

Firstly the Conference – if you came, I know you had a good time and took away something useful, because the feedback we got from the evaluation forms was very good and everyone was very positive. If you missed out, I need to know why. Was it because of the cost, travelling, childcare or simply because the information didn't get through to you in time or at all? Even if you didn't manage it this year, do try to find someone who did go and ask them what they thought and what they got out of it, so you can make a considered decision next time, which is likely to be in 2014.

So where does the WSC, now usually known as ScoutsWales, come in. Well they subsidised the Beaver Leaders' Conference by around 50%. Without their support we would have needed to pay more and get less (no lunch for example). In addition they pay for the Beaver Scout Team meetings twice a year, providing an opportunity for all the AACs or Area representatives to get together and discuss the issues and ideas that concern Beaver Scout Leaders at the grass roots. From these meetings come our All Wales initiatives, such as the Welsh Beaver Scout Award and Older Beaver Younger Scout Events.

Back to you then. The Beaver Scout Team for Wales are there to support you, but we need to know what you want. So please attend your District and Area meetings so your thoughts and concerns get put into the melting pot and find their way into the discussions and strategies of those who spend the money and set the targets. There is no point complaining that nobody listens

to you, if you are not speaking. Even if you only have a thin support network in your Area, you can always email or write to me with your thoughts. We are currently planning for 2011/2012. What initiative would you like to see promoted for the Section within Wales. Let us know and while we don't promise anything, we will look at any suggestions and put them on our agenda.

Good luck and good scouting for the new season and keep up the good work of increasing numbers and providing a good programme.

ORIENTEERING

Orienteering is a challenging outdoor adventure sport that exercises both the mind and the body. The aim is to navigate in sequence between control points marked on a unique orienteering map and decide the best route to complete the course in the quickest time. It does not matter how young, old or fit you are, as you can run, walk or jog the course and progress at your own pace.

Orienteering can take place anywhere from remote forest and countryside to urban parks and school playgrounds. The most challenging orienteering takes place in areas, which has demanding terrain and few paths.

To start orienteering all you need is a sense of adventure and a pair of trainers. It's a great sport for runners, joggers and walkers who want to improve their navigation skills or for anyone who loves the outdoors.

As a new activity for scouting I hope to develop the sport by providing CATI (come and try it) days, initially in Mid Wales where I have several mapped areas some of which, are in forestry and open moorland.

It is hoped that formal coaching sessions could be arranged for those who wish to take up the sport and if there is sufficient interest, inter area competitions.

As Scouts map reading and navigation are an integral part of our outdoor activities so why not improve these skills by participating in an orienteering activity. Anyone interested please contact ScoutsWales office.

Please contact me if you are qualified to run NSRA Youth Proficiency Tutors courses so we can work together to educate our Adults and Young people to be responsible shooters. Scouting requirements are in POR and FS120004 explains fully how a temporary range can be set up.

I would like to ask Area Commissioners it would be useful to have a point of contact i.e. an Adviser in each Area to help with the education and development and I hope you may be able to assist with this in due course.

SISTERS IN SCOUTING

On Wednesday, 21st April, Dilys Cardy was presented with the Scout Association's award of the 'Silver Acorn'. This award is presented to Scout Leaders with over 25 years of service and in recognition of specially distinguished service to Scouting.

HERITAGE NEWS

I was reading the latest Dyfed Family History Society journal a few weeks ago – an article by John Hughes who lived in Llanelli when he was a boy. He included a photograph of the 2nd Troop of Llanelli Scouts in the 1940s. I wrote to him and referred him to our History section on the ScoutsWales website. In his reply, he gave his permission to add his Scouting photograph to the website, with the comment that there was a lack of photographs. The Heritage committee is aware of this, the reason being that the material was originally intended to be a book and photographs were to be restricted in number. Now that it is all on the website we can add as many photographs as we would wish – so please, send us digital images of your Group/District photographs, especially ones of an early date, preferably with names.

Preserving our Scouting Heritage is an on going project. Local Anniversaries occur all the time – these are the ideal circumstances to look back on Group/District histories and gather information for a display at the celebration. Don't then bury them in a box in a dark corner! Send the information to anyone dealing with Heritage in Wales – we have a few Heritage Co-ordinators. The actual material could be preserved at the local Record Office where it can be seen by anyone who is interested.

Of course, another way forward is for Groups and Districts to add a History/Heritage Section to their own Website. That of Conwy District which includes material gathered by Brian Gregson is an excellent example. I'm sure there are many Scouts and Scouters who could help with this aspect. A great deal of history data could be recorded for posterity in this way and be accessible to all.

Howard Desmond, our representative in Cardiff, is fond of saying (to Groups or any Scouting body) "what you are doing TODAY is the history of tomorrow, so it is worth recording." His Area Commissioner is hoping to highlight some local group anniversaries in their Area AGM.

Scouting documents are continuing to turn up –

this year I have received log books for the 3rd City of Bangor Group for some years in the 1940s and 2nd City of Bangor in the early 1960s.

Conwy Scout Group celebrated their Centenary in the grand location of Conwy Castle. Please send me details of any other Centenary celebrations.

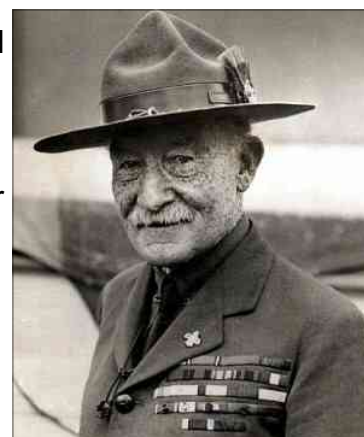

BADEN POWELL'S FOOTPRINT ACROSS BRITAIN

You may be interested in a book recently published, written by Steven Harris the author of several other books on Scouting history. The author has been on a trail of discovery from places to plaques, schools to statues, campsites to caravans, all of which have a unique Baden-Powell (and by definition Scouting) connection.



Of particular interest to Wales are the pages on Hon. Roland Philipps, from Pembrokeshire and the founder of Roland House.

The book is A4 in size with nearly 200 pages and well over 400 photographs, many previously unpublished.

SCOT-TREK 2010



Each year Snowdonia & Anglesey organise a trek to Scotland. This year they forsook the mainland and went to Rum, an island off the west coast some six miles north/south and the same east/west. Apart from the SNH scientists and their dependants it is uninhabited. One small settlement, a very modest shop and no pub! A truly desert island without the waving palms but, in August, with more than the odd midge. Access is by a four times a week ferry and once on the island the expedition split into three groups and set off to explore. The pattern was to take two or three days rations and when these were exhausted return to the settlement



to pick up more pre-packed rations, have a shower and set off again. There are two 4x4 tracks across the island and a number of lesser paths. The SE quadrant comprises some rocky mountains with scrambling possibilities.

The organisation is simplicity itself. Invite a leader team (Terrain Two, UK-wide qualified). run a training day to teach the Explorer Scouts how to make up nine days rations, sort out tent groups etc. Book a minibus, drive to Mallaig and catch the ferry. You are then on an idyllic island where you can roam at will. Two attractive bothies are available, sandy beaches with no one on them, and wonderful views of the Hebrides. Take a camera for the red deer which will come as close as 30 metres in the day and walk past your tent at night. Fresh droppings proved it. The cost was £120 per person and that included a very nice end of expedition meal in Mallaig.

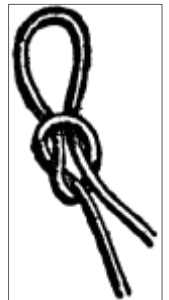
